The ASBC's performance measured by actions, not just only words. During those 12 months, ASBC showed the world that it is a positive, responsible and pioneering sports organization. The year began with the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships in Bangkok 2019, which was a success story in many aspects; From number of the participants and the athletes' experience to excellent organization. This championship has opened up new horizons, especially for women as we have witnessed the launching of the first bout in the world using Hijab, this will allow for thousands of athletes to follow their dreams with no conflicts with their beliefs.

ASBC family has met to elect new board members during ASBC General Assembly which took place in Bangkok City on the margin of the championship. The meeting held in an absolute trans

are detailed in this annual report.

Together we are building a new era of ASBC which will reflect to our boxers, officials and the national federations. Our priority in 2020 is implementing the strategy - continuing to stabilize and rejuvenate the activities. We began this year with confidence after significant developments in the past year and a positive reaction to our plan.

In ASBC, we rarely have the luxury of looking backwards, and everyone has their eyes firmly fixed on the future. We have every reason to look ahead with optimism about what that future will bring.

ASBC history side by side to hundred and seventy boys boxers. The spirit of friendship has dominated the championship despite strong competition among the boxers.

In compliance with the technological revolution, we have launched a mobile application for the first time the world to facilitate data accessing process to all sectors, especially for the athletes. Ulaanbaatar city hosted ASBC Asian Youth Men & Women Boxing Championships, among very cold weather; however, the warm hospitality was dominating. Our future's champions competed at a very high level to build the first building block of their career.

The end of the story was spectacular with the first edition of ASBC Grand Slam Boxing Championship. ASBC has signed an agreement with FCIT company early in the year as one of the leading sports companies in the region to organize the ASBC Grand Slam series. The championship was a great support to the boxers as well as the national federations. Over the year, 873 boxers have competed to obtain 317 medals, 793 bouts have been conducted under the highest standard of fair play. Furthermore, all these events, activities and achievements

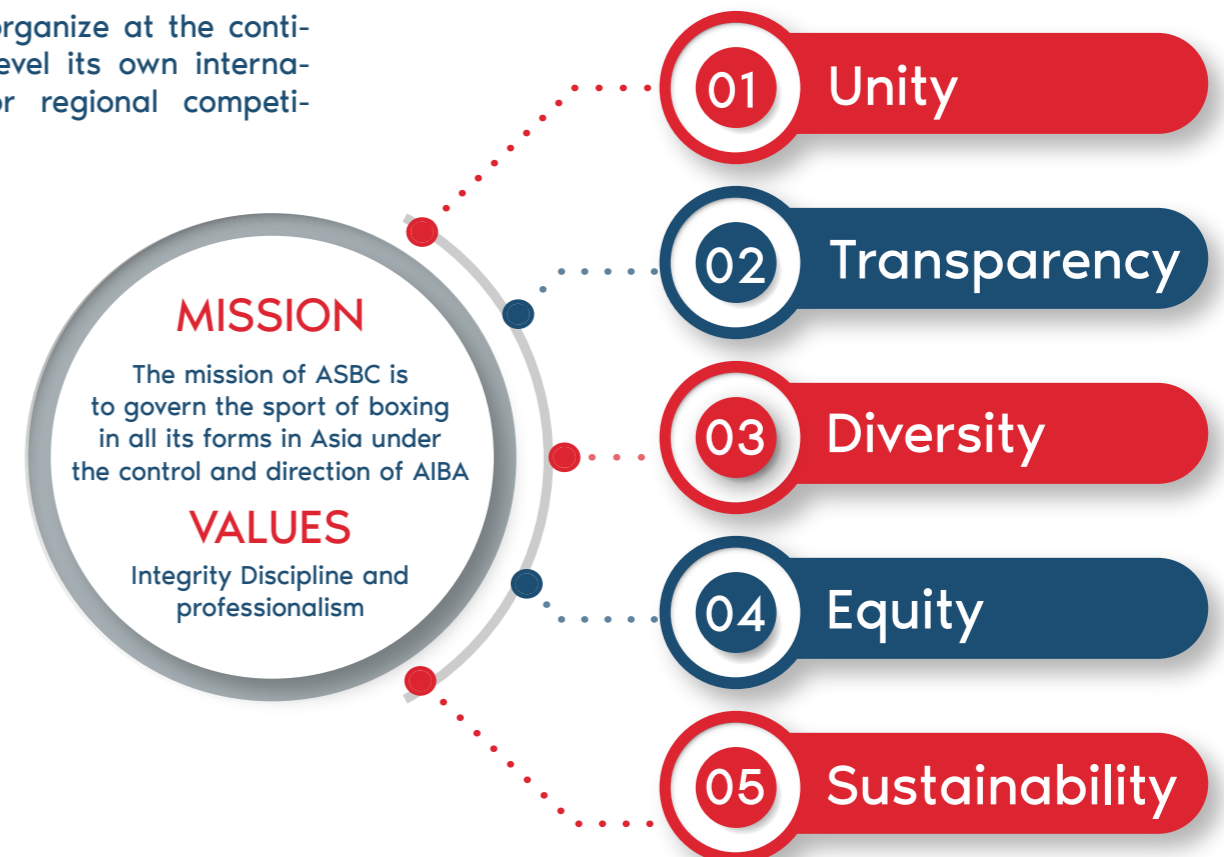
The first step has been taken to elevate our boxers' level was arranging the first-ever ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships later in the year. It was impressive when in one line two crafts directly meet, by organizing the first edition of schoolboys' championship and celebrating the lifting of suspension from Kuwaiti Sport. To be honest; those young boxers influenced me more than other boxers, It was an emotional moment when I saw a 14 years old boxer was crying while he was listening to his national anthem, and his flag raised.

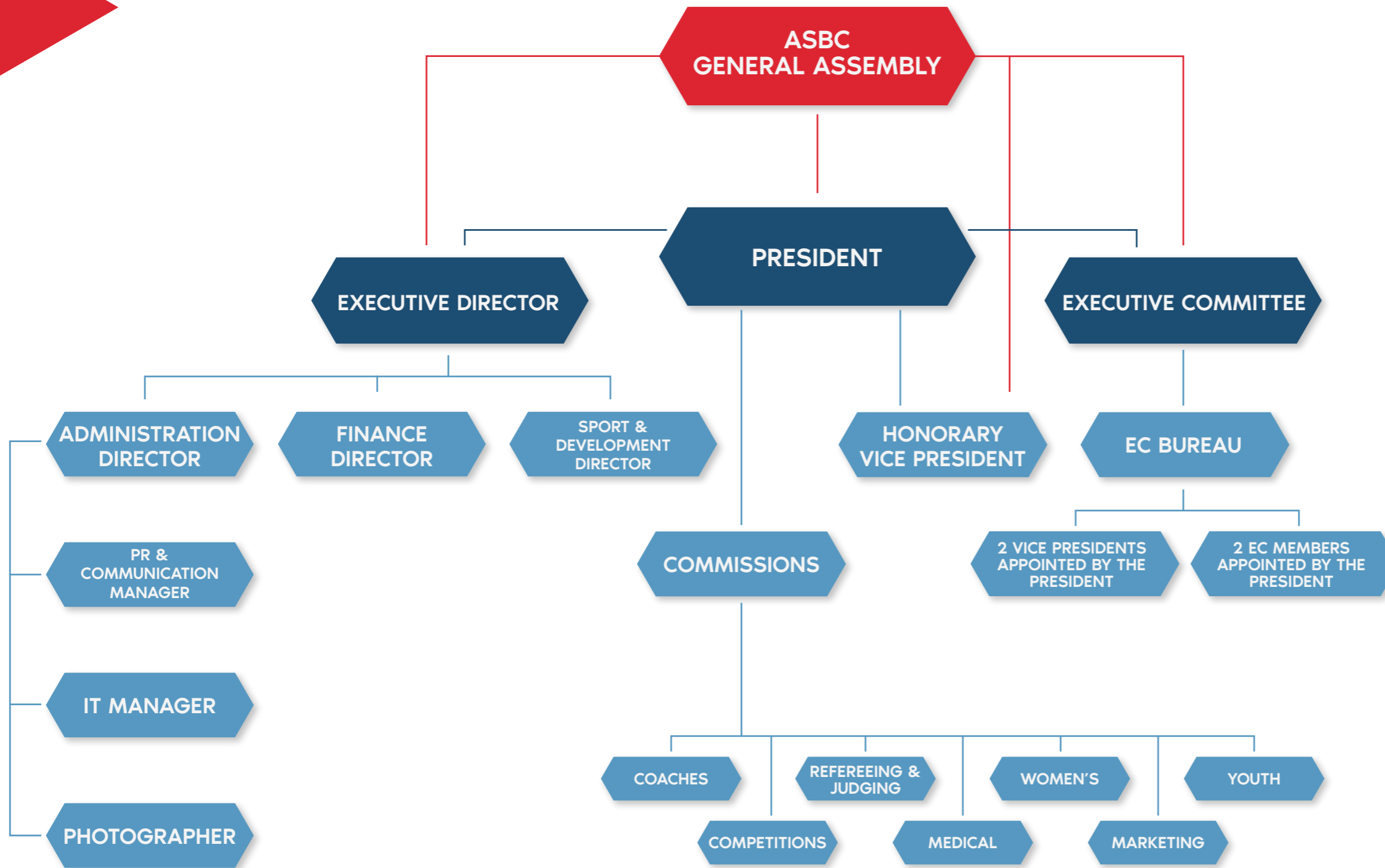
Later on, ASBC Asian Junior Boys & Girls Boxing Championships wrote another new chapter in our history. The championship took place in Fujairah city, of the northern part of the United Arab Emirates. Sixty-nine girls' boxers have shown their talents for the first time in the

Forty-three federations from Asian Continent and thousands of athletes who represent them, as well as coaches, officials, judges are the main body of the ASBC family. ASBC family is the concept who describe our philosophy that aiming to spread the sports' spirit among the athletes as well as the whole officials. Our diversity is the secret of our power; more than 40 nations share the same boxing language. Our goal is to create an environment conducive to develop boxing sport in our continent in all aspects that are sensitive to our values.



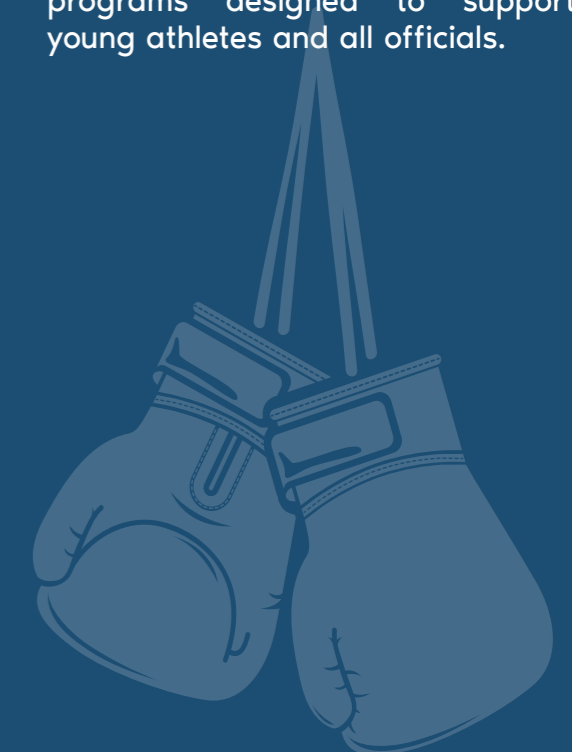
- i.** To improve, promote, and spread within Asia the sport of boxing in all its forms, in the light of its educational, cultural and sports values and to initiate programs designed to support young athletes.
- ii.** To generally promote boxing as a healthy and educational activity for people, to protect the safety of boxers and their welfare at all levels, notably by promoting and controlling a good sporting practice.
- iii.** To ensure the enforcement of the AIBA Technical and Competition Rules at all international, regional or national competitions organized on the continent.
- iv.** To organize at the continental level its own international or regional competitions.
- v.** To ensure that all competitions open to National Federations are held in accordance with the AIBA Technical and Competition Rules.
- vi.** To regulate boxing in all its forms at the continental level in accordance with this Constitution and its Bylaws, the AIBA Bylaws, the AIBA Technical and Competition Rules, the Code of Ethics and the Disciplinary Code, the AIBA Procedural Rules and the AIBA Anti-Doping Rules.
- vii.** To ensure unity between AIBA, AIBA Affiliates, other Confederations and the National Federations.
- viii.** To protect and care for the safety and interest of boxers.
- ix.** To train and improve the quality and transparency of all Officials.
- x.** To prevent any method, practice or action that could compromise the regularity or the result of the competitions
- xi.** To respect the Olympic Charter and further promote the sport of boxing.
- xii.** To promote the involvement of women in the sport of boxing and enhance women's boxing programs.





The Asian Boxing Confederation (ASBC) is a not-for-profit organization that governs the sport of boxing in all its forms in Asia. It is established in accordance with Article 60ff of the Swiss Civil Code and is unlimited in duration. ASBC has its legal seat in Lausanne (Switzerland). ASBC has its central administration office where the President of Confederation resides and may have other decentralized offices which the President may decide.

The mission of ASBC is to govern the sport of boxing in all its forms in Asia. Additionally, the main objectives are to improve, promote and spread the boxing sport within the Asian Continent in all its forms in the light of its educational, cultural and sports values and to initiate programs designed to support young athletes and all officials.



Altogether thirty-six delegations had the voting rights in the ASBC General Assembly. In addition, two countries attended as observers. The five zones of the Asian Continent sent their delegations to the ASBC General Assembly where the highest participation figure has been recorded in the history of any meetings of the Asian Boxing Confederation.

In accordance with the ASBC Constitution article 32.1/B, the Asian's AIBA EC members were automatically ASBC Executive Committee members. Those members are:-

- Mr. Pichai Chunhavajira of Thailand,
- Ms. Shelly Selowati H. Soejono of Indonesia and
- Mr. Yousuf Ali Al-Kazem of Qatar.

The scrutineers were appointed before the commencement of the official elections as per both AIBA and ASBC rules. Two ASBC Vice-Presidents and nine ASBC Executive Committee members were elected by the voting delegations of the ASBC General Assembly by secret ballots in eleven rounds.

Both Mr. Wu Di from China and Mr. Jae Joon Yoo from South Korea's were elected as new Vice-Presidents of the Asian Boxing Confederation. The newly elected members are representing each zone of the Asian Continent.

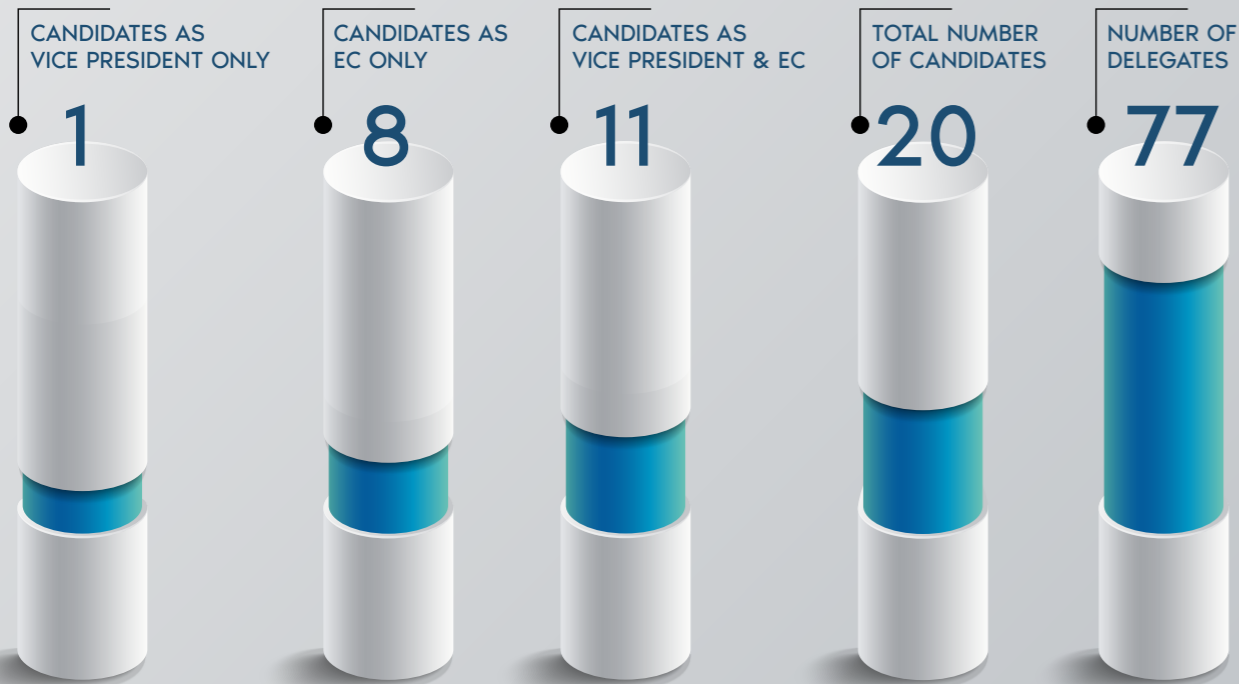
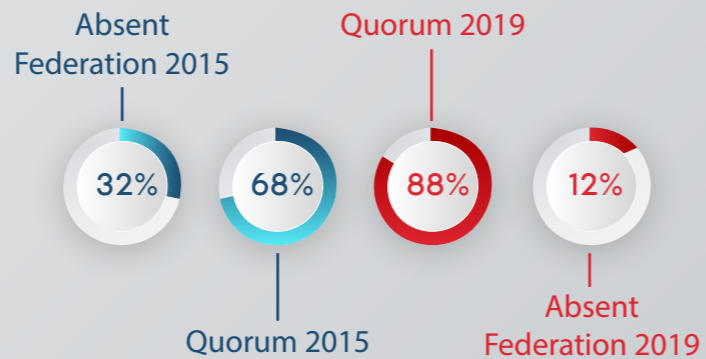






The ASBC General Assembly was held in the Grand Fourwings Hotel in Bangkok, Thailand where thirty-six delegations were present in the most important Asian meeting. The ASBC President and AIBA Vice-President Mr. Anas Alotaiba, AIBA Executive Director Mr. Tom Virgets, President of the Thailand Boxing Association Mr. Pichai Chunchavajira and ASBC Executive Director Mr. Ali Salameh led the ASBC General Assembly in Bangkok. The ASBC General Assembly took place before taking off the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women

Boxing Championship. The fruitful meeting delivered excellent unity of our continent in Bangkok. The approval of new amendments of the ASBC Constitution on the agenda of the ASBC General Assembly. According to the newly approved rules, the ASBC Executive Committee will consist of sixteen members. The ASBC Competition Calendar was also approved by the delegates which concluded five continental events in 2019 covering all age groups. Thailand, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Mongolia and Uzbekistan were to host ASBC major continental championships. Additionally, the ASBC Budget and the appointment of the External Auditor were approved.

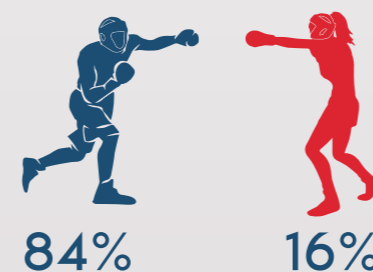
Medal Distribution in last 3 Olympics Game

When boxing made its Olympic debut at the 1904 Games in St Louis, it was the USA, the only country entered, which took all the medals. Later, the Americans continued to dominate boxing, winning 109 medals (including 48 gold) out of the 842, closely followed by the Cubans and Russians. Since its inclusion in the Olympic program, boxing has been staged at each edition of the Games, except in 1912 in Stockholm, owing to Swedish law, which forbade the practice. The rules have evolved since the 1980s:

- 1984 in Los Angeles: protective helmet obligatory;
- 1992 in Barcelona set-up of an electronic scoring system to strengthen the objectivity of refereeing;
- 2007 standardized point-scoring.
- 2012 London Games in London women's boxing made its debut.
- 2016 Rio Games in Brazil 36 female boxers participated.
- 2020 Tokyo Games in Japan will conduct the new weights category (8 Men & 5 Women)

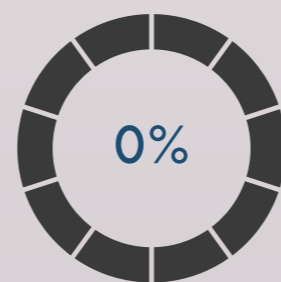
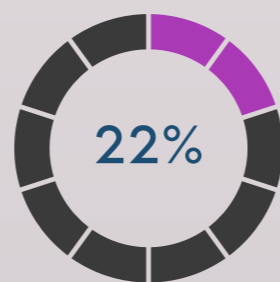
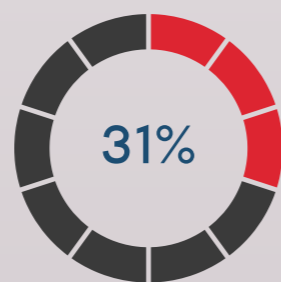
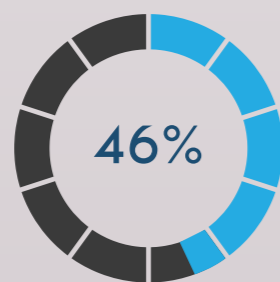
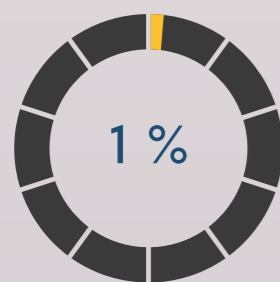
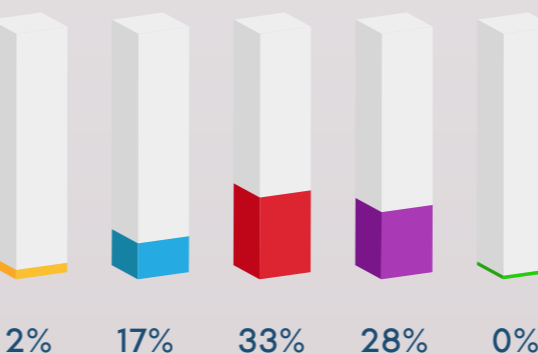
Beijing 2008 Medal Distribution



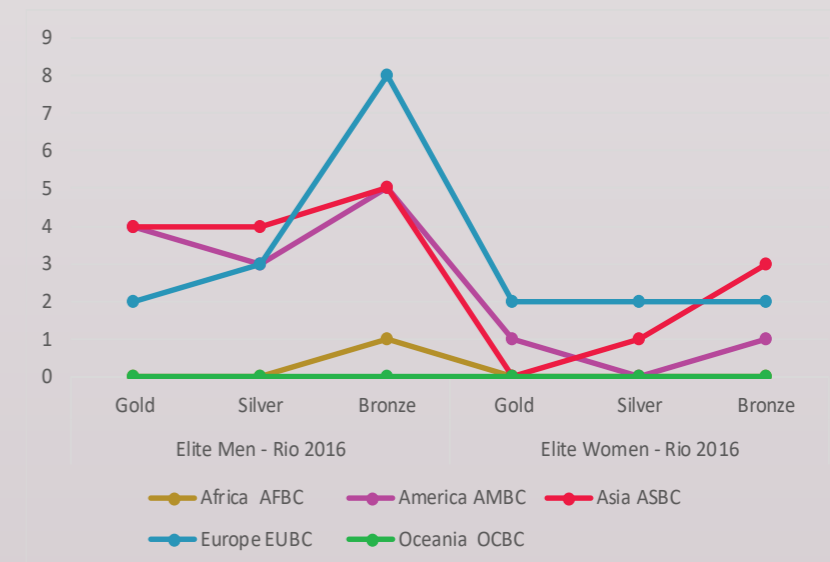
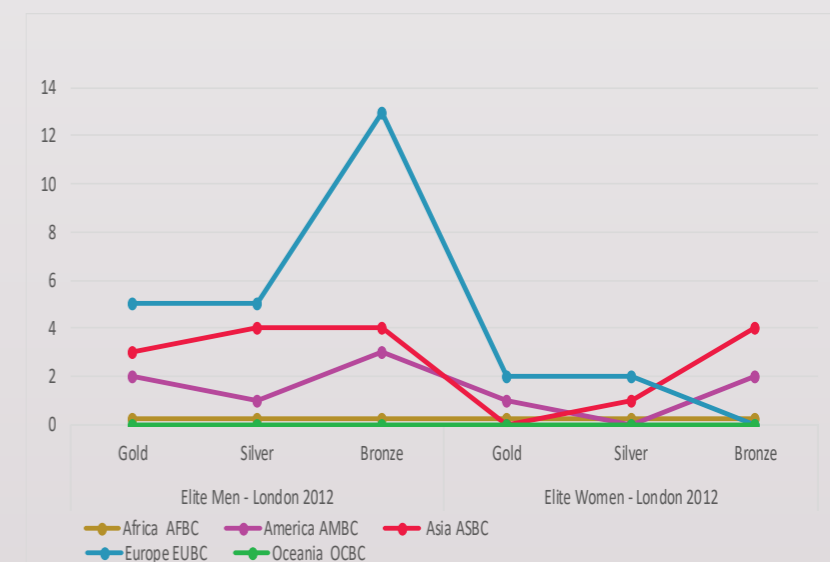
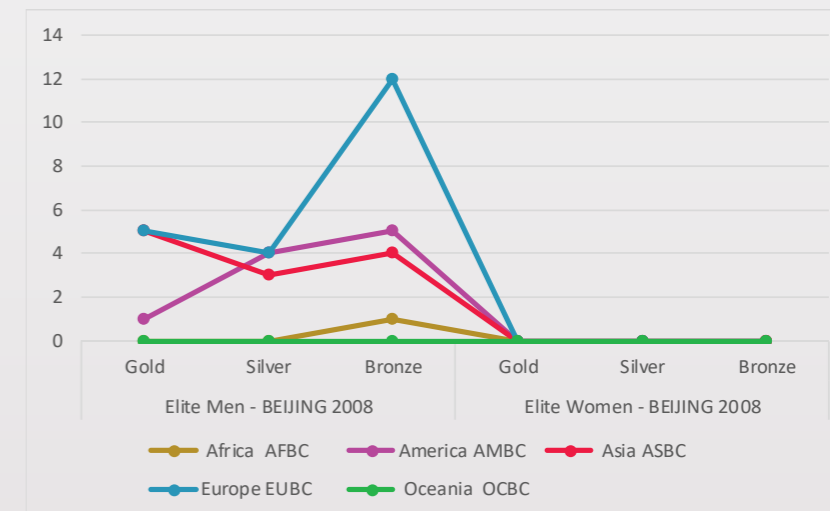
London 2012 Medal Distribution

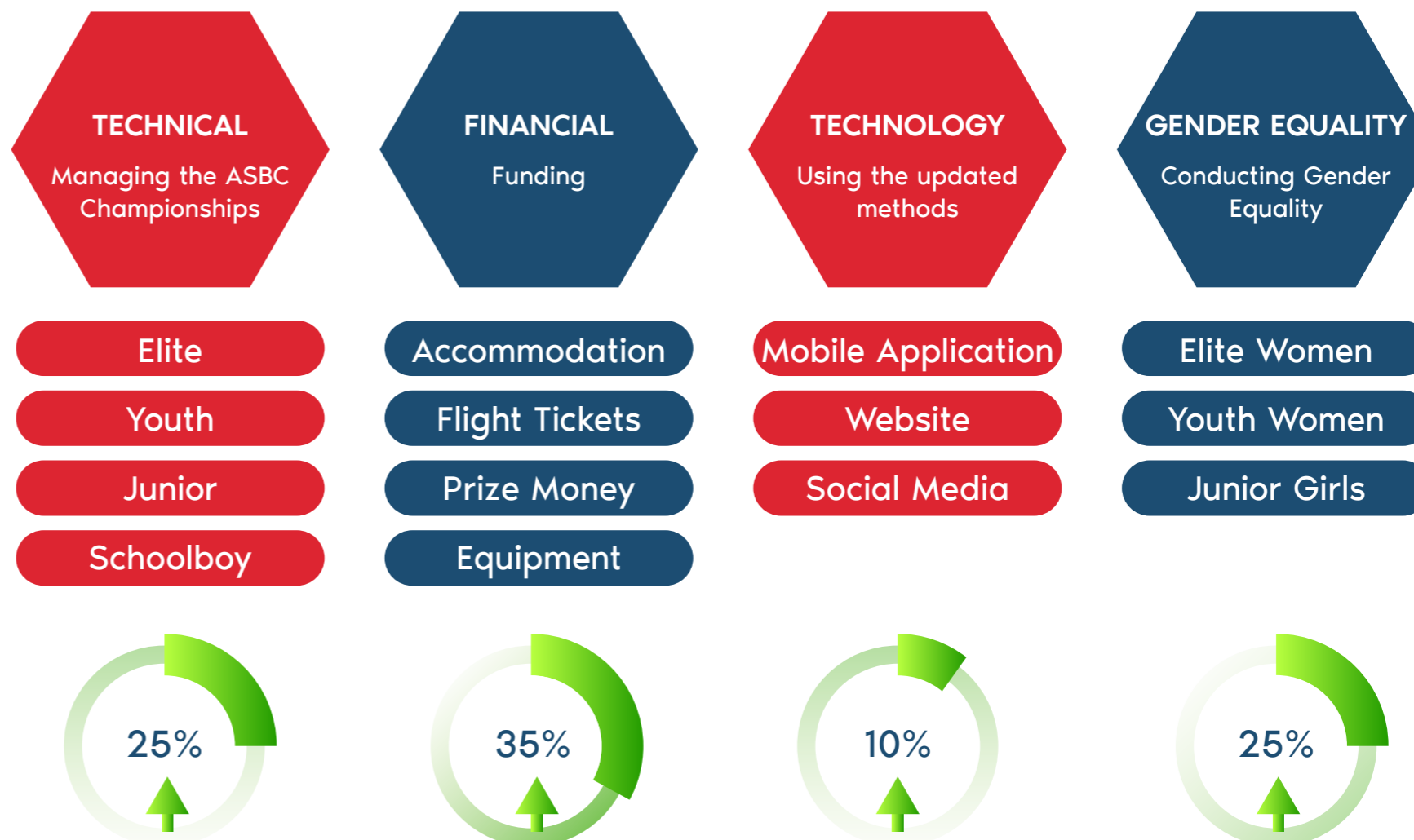

Besides, the first-ever Asian Grand Slam Championship presented hand by hand with FCIT, ASBC partner; the championship was direct support to the athletes as our partner covered all the expenses (flight tickets, accommodation and prize money).

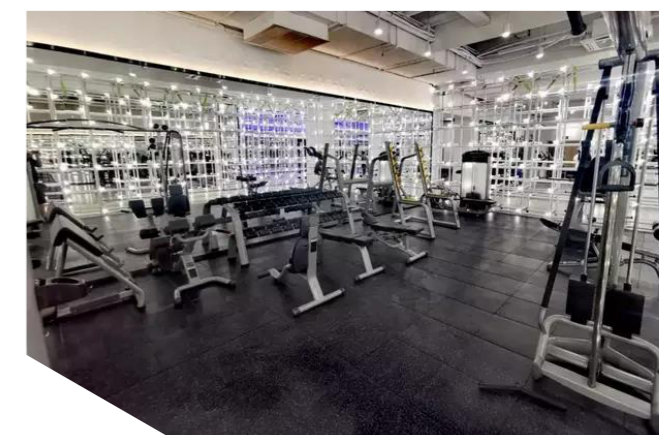

In addition to many technical meetings held before each championships to educate our teams coaches and managers which led by ASBC experts.

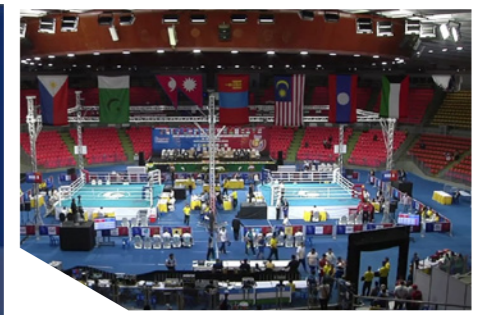
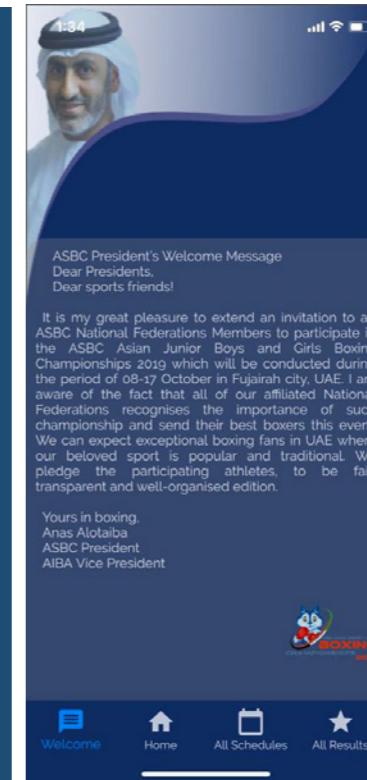
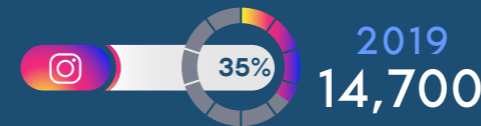

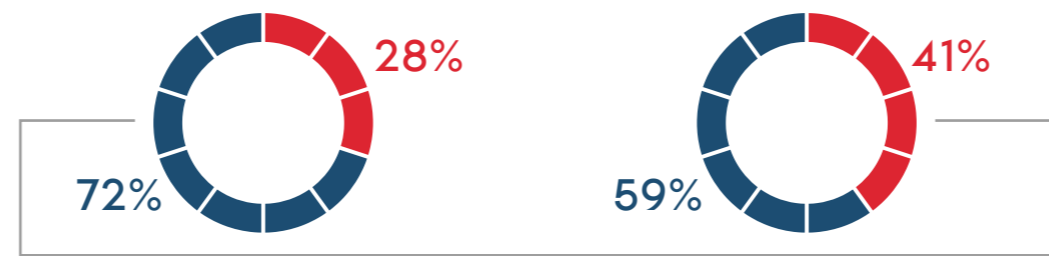
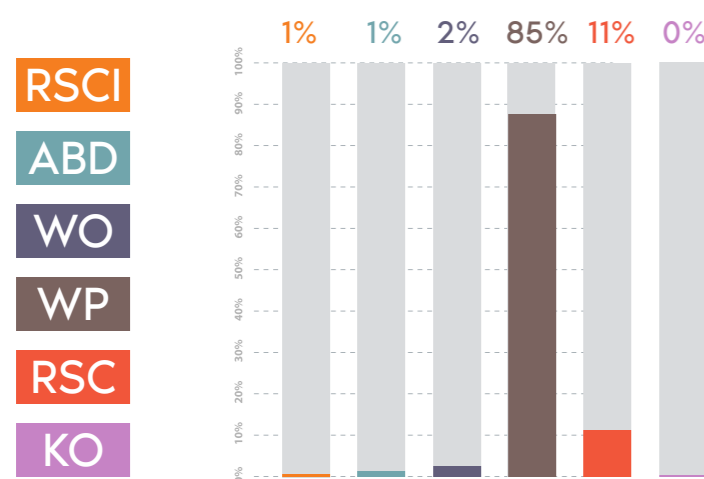
MEDAL DISTRIBUTION FOR MEN



MEDAL DISTRIBUTION FOR WOMEN



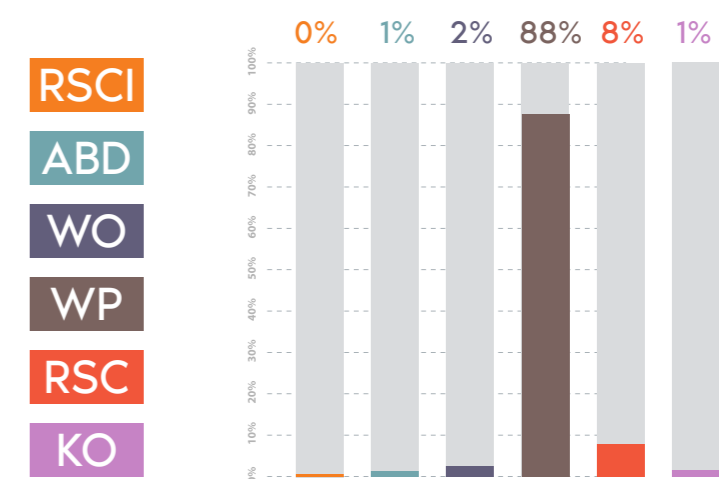
TECHNICAL STATISTICS FOR MEN BOXERS

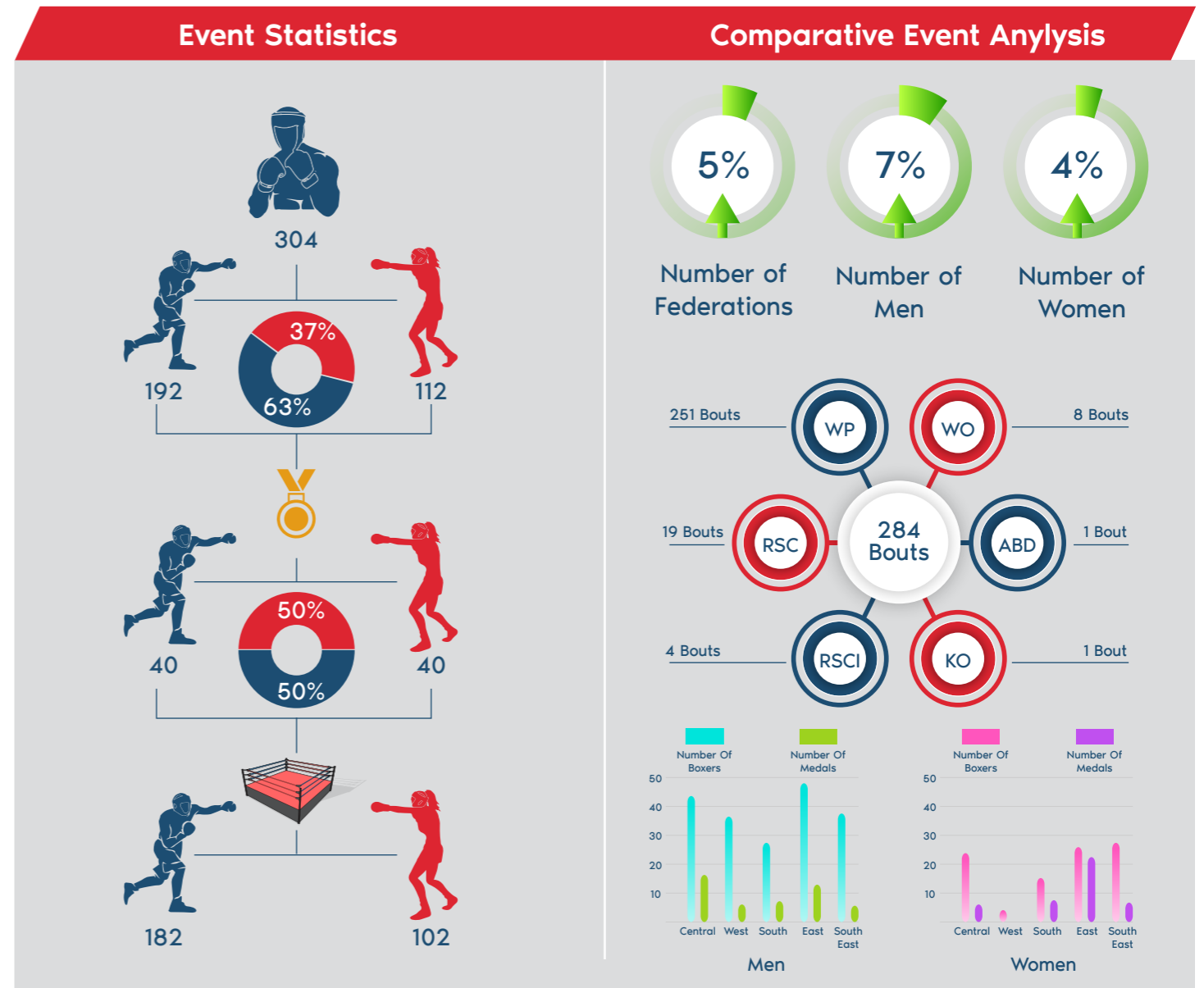

The first event in 2019 was the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships, Bangkok- Thailand. At the very first time in the history of the elite events, both genders were attending at the same time in Thailand's capital which was scheduled to take place on April 16-27. The championship has held in ten women and ten men weight classes according to the AIBA Technical Rules. Boxers who were born between 1979 and 2000 were eligible to attend in the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships. The

competition was held in the Huamark Indoor Stadium which had the capacity of 6,000 seats. The official accommodation place for the team delegations was the 4-stars Golden Tulip Sovereign Hotel which had the distance of 5.8km from the Huamark Indoor Stadium. The first historical edition of the Asian Boxing Championships started in Bangkok, Thailand in 1963. The metropolis also hosted the Asian continental event for the elite boxers in 1973, in 1985, in 1991, in 1992 and last time in 2015. Bangkok has got strong experiences

hosting the highest level of international events. The Thailand Boxing Association welcomed the boxers in the 2017 and 2018 editions of the ASBC Asian Confederation Youth Boxing Championships. The last edition of ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships took place in Tashkent, Uzbekistan 2017. Finally, the competition returned to Bangkok after four years.

Yashwardhan Singh Best Schoolboys



The first historical edition of the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships which is a great step forward in our road. Following our strategies have been fixed, ASBC strongly supported to launch this continental event for our 13 and 14-year-old hopes. The Kuwait sport was suspended in the recent years, but the country was planning to return to the boxing map, and ASBC decided to give them a perfect chance for

the comeback hosting an ASBC Asian Championships in 2019. Kuwait Boxing Federation had the capability to host big events, and we were satisfied with their preparations and work during the championship. The post-Soviet countries arrived at the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships with strong teams as in all age groups, but many of the other nations have got potentials in this event. ASBC expected a high level of competition here in Kuwait

City, but the quality of the boxers are amazed us and all officials. This age group is very important, and most of them started their international boxing career here in this event. We want to continue our new tradition in 2020 to arrange the 2nd edition for both genders. ASBC had high interest in this new event, out of the registered 25. Finally, 21 nations arrived with 150 young boxers to Kuwait City.



Top Eight

Rank No.1 – Uzbekistan

Uzbekistan topped the team rankings with their 10 gold medals, and all of their 14 boxers reached the semi-finals in Kuwait City. Uzbekistan's performance was a clear dominance over any other countries of the Asian continent, proving their background is stronger than ever. The best performances within the Uzbek team produced by 13-year-old Farrukh Tulaganov (40kg), Umidillo Abdurasulov (43kg), Boburbek Bobojonov (46kg), Dalerjon Bozorov (52kg) and Shavkatjon Boltayev (64kg) in Kuwait City.

Rank No.5 – Turkmenistan

Turkmenistan could send only five boxers to the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships, but four of them reached medals in Kuwait City. Dovlet Nurmuradov did not have a realistic chance in the final of the 43kg weight class, but his performance was over the previous expectations. The peak performance from Turkmenistan was delivered by Alisher Orazbayev who dominated his fights during the road to the finals of the 40kg, and he had only a narrow loss to his Uzbek opponent.

Rank No. 2 – India

Out of the participating 14 Indian boxers, eight advanced to the semi-finals, and among them sensationally seven joined to the finals. The final result of the Indian schoolboy team was two gold medals, five silver and one bronze in Kuwait City. The Best Boxer Trophy was achieved by Yashwardhan Singh at the 58kg weight class, but tall Joon Bharat (70kg) also claimed a gold medal in the event. Aryan (37kg) and Vinay Vishwakarma (49kg) were near to get also titles, but both lost to their Uzbek opponents closely in the finals.

Rank No.6 – Philippines

The Philippines also sent five boxers to the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships as Turkmenistan, and these athletes attended in the five smallest weight classes due to the genetics of the Southeast Asian people. Reymond Lofranco (46kg) arrived at the event with nearly 100 bouts during his previous career, and finally, he took a silver medal in Kuwait City. Philippines' second medal a bronze was achieved by Robert Malunoc Jr. at the 35kg weight class.

Rank No.3 – Kazakhstan

The rivalry between Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan are always the key moments in the ASBC Asian Championships. This time the Kazakh boxers were exceptional until the semi-finals, 10 out of their 14 talents reached the medal phase of the event. Most of their boxers lost to Uzbeks in the semi-finals, and only three Kazakhs marched to the finals. Batyrkhan Seitenov (67kg) and Yerdos Sharipbek (+70kg) not only claimed the gold medals in Kuwait City, but both boxers dominated all of their fights.

Rank No.7 – Afghanistan

Afghanistan never ranked as high in the previous Asian team rankings as in this first edition of the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships. As Turkmenistan and Philippines, Afghanistan was able to send also five athletes to Kuwait City. The strong developments of the new Afghan management could recognize their first real successes and earned two bronze medals with an excellent performance from 13-year-old Mohammad Younus Amiri (40kg) and Shirzai Masiullah (43kg).

Rank No.4 – Kyrgyzstan

The Kyrgyz boxing team arrived with a maximum number of 14 boxers to Kuwait City as Uzbekistan, India, Kazakhstan and the host country. Six Kyrgyz boxers advanced to the semi-finals, which is one of the best performances of the Central Asian country in recent years. Kyrgyzstan is waiting for his first ASBC Champion since 2013, and the gold was also missing from their collection in Kuwait City. Their three silver and three bronze medals are top results in this level, and Bekzat Ergeshov (35kg) and Atay Asanbekov (70kg) was near to get gold in Kuwait City.

Rank No.7 – Tajikistan

Tajikistan also reached same points in the team rankings as Afghanistan and also two bronze medals in Kuwait City finally, which means their squad ranked as 7th in the first ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships. The nine Tajiks proved strong technical and tactical skills which delivered their two bronze medals. Ruslan Gafurov (37kg) and Shakhboz Dadajonov (52kg) were their medallists in Kuwait City, but Muinkhon Mavlonov (35kg) and Jafar Rahmonov (43kg) also performed well in the event.

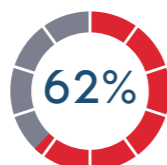

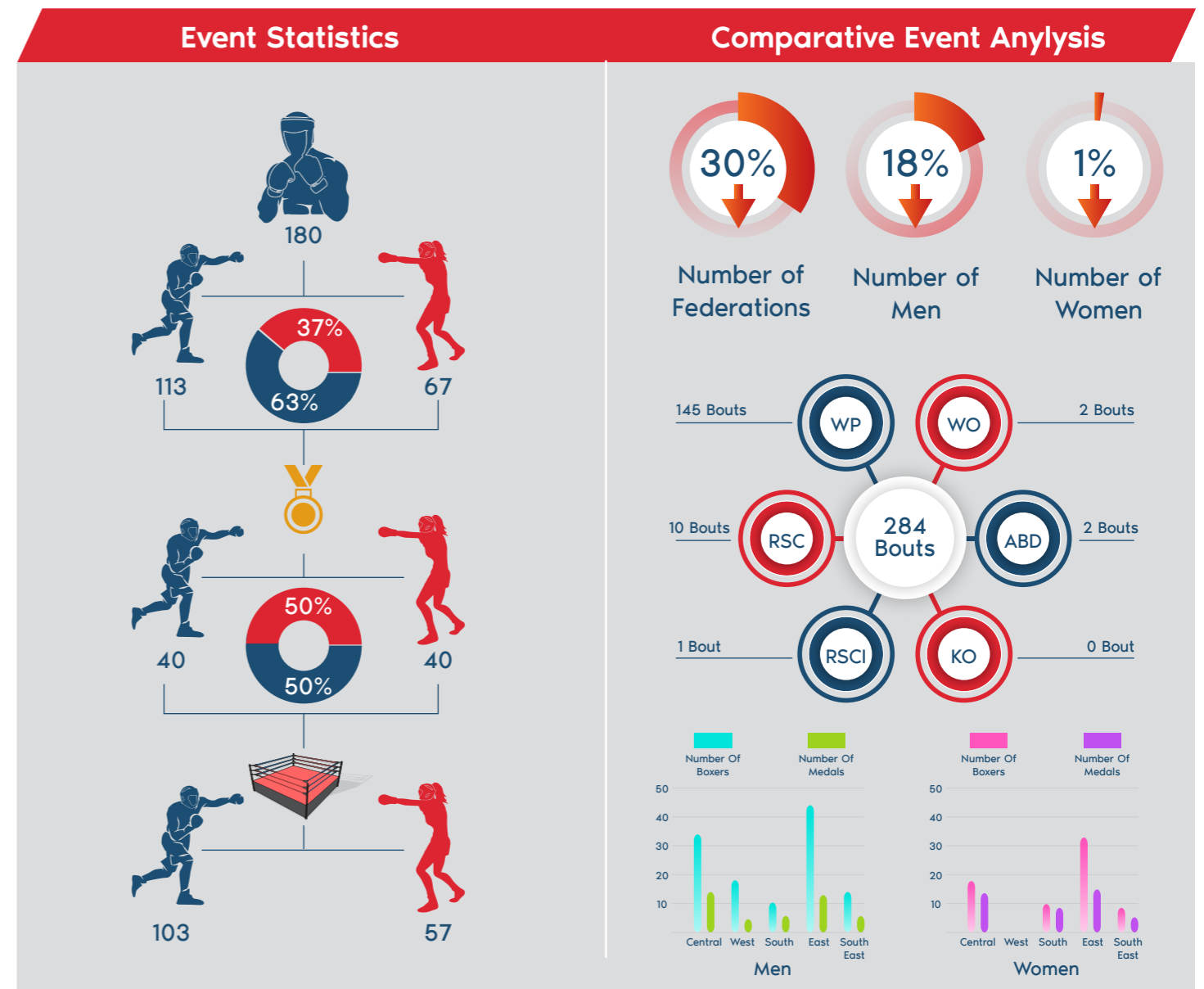


THAILAND

The official draw of the ASBC Asian Youth Men & Women Boxing Championships was held in the Bayangol Hotel following the Technical Meeting of the event. The number of the countries was 16 in the ASBC the championship in Ulaanbaatar. The number of the boxers was 180 and among them 113 male and 67 female athletes. The top boxing nations as Kazakhstan and India arrived with a

maximum number of 20 boxers to the championship. Chinese Taipei arrived with a record number of 19 boxers to the new edition. Uzbekistan sent 18 boxers to this competition among the top nations, but China, South Korea, host Mongolia, Iran and Thailand also had big teams in the competition. From the developing Asian countries Iraq, Singapore and Sri Lanka also sent their boxers to the

event in Ulaanbaatar. The boxers who were born between 2001 and 2002 were eligible to compete in such championship. Altogether 20 female and male champions were crowned in the ASBC Asian Youth Men, and Women Boxing Championships were 10 women and 10 men weight classes.





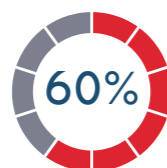

Following the four major ASBC Championships, a new event, The Asian Grand Slam, organized before the end of the year. The idea of the first-ever Asian Grand Slam arisen many years ago but the project is now realized with the support of the Asian Boxing Confederation and FCIT Company, the ASBC partner. The registration was opened in early November 2019 to all Asian National Federations for the Asian Grand Slam. The championship host city was in Xiamen, China during the period of December 18-22. Four boxers attend each weight class. Altogether 13 champions crowned in the event in 5 women weight classes and 8 men divisions which are the official Olympic categories. The first edition of the Asian Grand Slam is a money prize event; all the medallists have got payments during the competition in the city of Xiamen. FCIT covered all the accommodation, transportation and flight tickets for the team delegates. The first edition of the ASBC Asian Grand Slam Boxing Championships started with its first competition day in Xiamen which is located in the Fujian Province of the People's Republic of China. The Technical Meeting of the new event was held in Xiamen and it is confirmed that 27 selected top boxers to compete in China from eleven different countries from all regions of Asia. The President of the Asian Boxing Confederation, Mr. Anas Alotaiba of United Arab Emirates, arrived in the venue of competition to lead the Technical Meeting of the event together with the Technical Delegate of the historical championship, Mr. Ray Silvas of the United States. The Vice-President of the Asian Boxing Confederation Mr. Wu Di of China also welcomed all guests and participating teams in the Technical Meeting. The following 11 nations attended in the ASBC Asian Grand Slam Boxing Championships in Xiamen: Australia, India, Malaysia, Mongolia, Nepal, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Tajikistan, Chinese Taipei, and United Arab Emirates. One of the biggest names of the whole event was Chinese Taipei's Huang Hsiao Wen who claimed a gold medal in the last edition of the AIBA Women's World Boxing Championships in Ulan-Ude. Mongolia's Asian Games silver medallist Baatarsukh Chinzorig was one of the top stars of the men's part of the Grand Slam.

Boxing is not about two athletes fighting each other in the ring, it is much deeper than that, it is a meaning reflection of dignity, courage and perseverance.

Following Kazakhstan's Daniyar Yeleussinov's and Uzbekistan's Shakhram Giyasov's successes a middleweight (75kg) star Israil Madrimov of Uzbekistan won the Best Asian Man Elite Boxers Award. The powerful Uzbek boxer was silver medallist at the Incheon 2014 Asian Games at the age of 19 and following four years of experiences in all level of boxing he became the flagbearer of Team Uzbekistan at the Opening Ceremony of the Jakarta 2018 Asian Games. Madrimov defeated all of his rivals in the Asian Games with strong performances including Philippines' No.1 Eumir Felix Marcial and Kazakhstan's AIBA World Boxing Championships silver medallist Abilkhan Amankul.

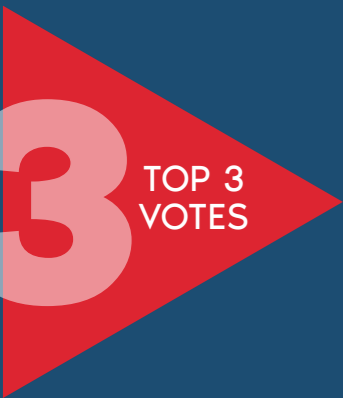
Mr. Raffaele Bergamasco, India (Italy)

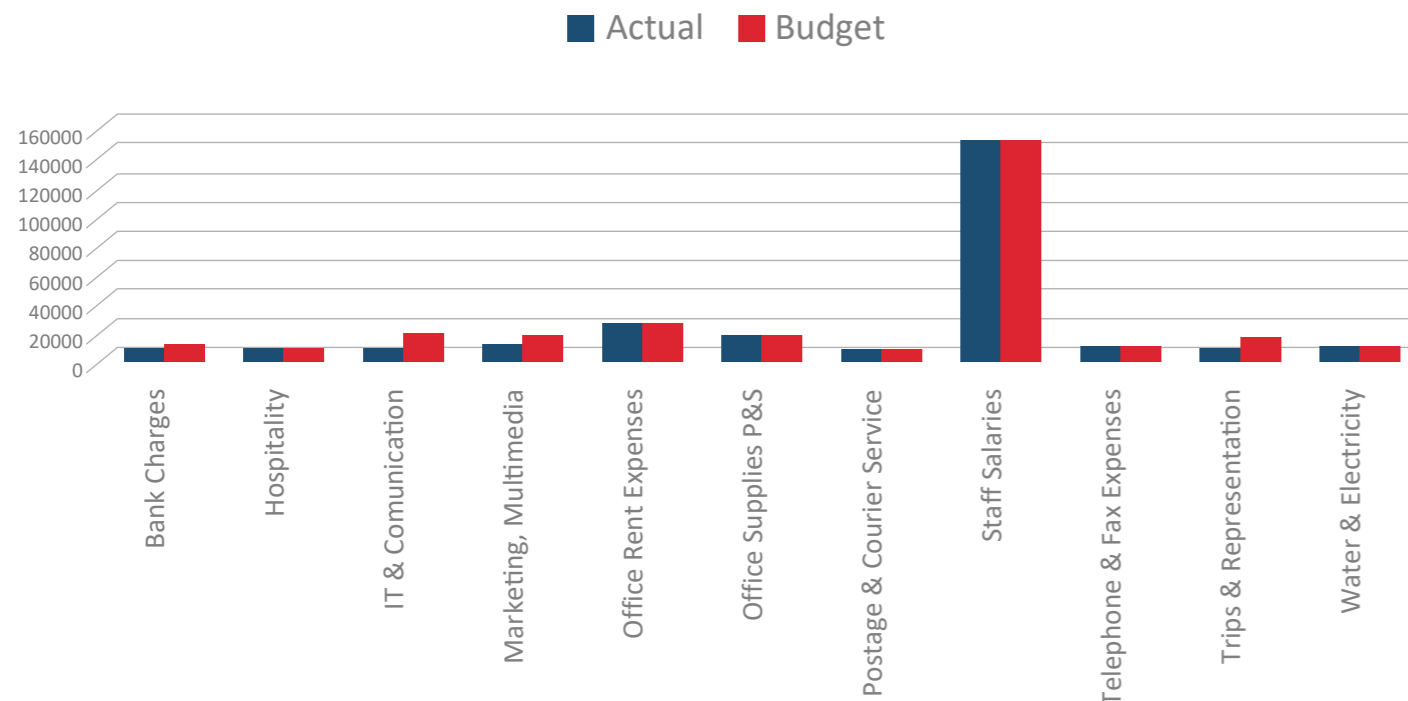
INCOME ACTUAL VS BUDGET 19



DIRECT ACTIVITIES COST AC VS. BUDGET

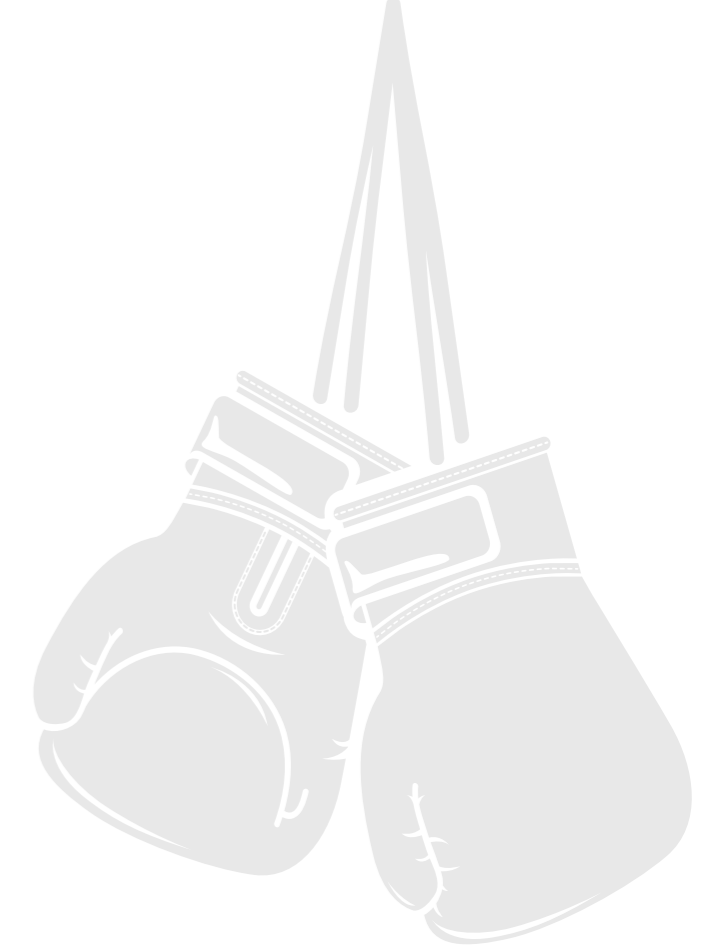


ADMINISTRATION EXPENSES ACT VS. BUDGET
